Day 1 Crossing the river Jordan

Now it came about after the death of Moses the servant of the Lord, that the Lord spoke to Joshua the son of Nun, Moses' servant, saying, <sup>2</sup> "Moses My servant is dead; so now arise, cross this Jordan, you and all this people, to

the land which I am giving to them, to the sons of Israel.

There come times of transition that God calls us to as we follow him. Joshua had been in training for this. He was one of the two faithful men, along with Caleb, who had demonstrated a willingness to obey the call of God even when others backed away. Now was his time to take the helm. He did not choose this role. God chose him for it. When God leads us, the initiative is always His, and it comes with a promise. Our task is to obey.

For the Israelites in this story, the call of God brought them back to something they had tried to avoid. It was time to cross the Jordan into the promised land. They had already said no to that call once. But God doesn't give up on his purposes for his people and he brought them back for another attempt. If they said "yes, Lord" this time, it would be an action of faith that would mark the beginning of a new era for the people.


Maybe there was a time where you came to a transition in your life and did not have the courage to cross over. Rather than obey, you took a route that seemed easier. You avoided that crossing and went looking for another way. But it didn't work. Maybe you found yourself back out in the wilderness, just like the Israelites did. The wilderness where we wander, waiting for the unbelief in us to die.

As God calls us, we step out in faith to obey. We will see God doing his will among us.


#### Pennies for Pastors.


